

BEAR LAKE COUNTY SPECIAL COMMISSIONERS' MEETING

MAY 20, 2021

COMMISSIONERS' CHAMBERS – PARIS, IDAHO

The Board of Bear Lake County Commissioners met in a special meeting on May 20, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Chambers, following the CDC's safe distancing guidelines and Governor's order, in Paris, Idaho. Members present were Commissioners' Vaughn N. Rasmussen, Chairman, Rex L. Payne and Clerk of the Board, Cindy Garner.

Others attending were Sheriff Bart Heslington, Prosecutor Joe Hayes and Kathi Izatt, reporter for The News-Examiner.

APPROVE AGENDA – ACTION ITEM

MOTION: Commissioner Payne made a motion to approve the agenda for May 20, 2021, as posted, seconded by Commissioner Jensen, motion carried

PAUL SOUSA – FISH HAVEN GENERAL STORE – CATERING PERMIT – ACTION ITEM

Paul Sousa with Fish Haven General Store met to request a catering permit to do an IPA (India Pale Ale) event on Saturday, June 26, 2021, serving customer preferences in the area. There were some questions regarding his state license and on premise consumption. The prosecutor will look into it and get back with Mr. Sousa. Commissioners will put it on first on the agenda under general action items for the June 14, 2021 meeting.

CANVASS MAY 18, 2021 ELECTION – ACTION ITEM

Clerk Garner presented the Commissioners with the final results of the May 18, 2021 Library Trustee and Bear River Mosquito Abatement Annexation Elections. Final results may be requested from the Clerk's office. It was a very low voter turnout of just over 14%.

MOTION: Commissioner Payne made a motion to accept the results of the May 18, 2021 Library Trustee and Bear River Mosquito Abatement Annexation Elections as presented, seconded by Commissioner Rasmussen, motion carried.

MAVERIK ACCESS – ACTION ITEM

Commissioner Rasmussen reminded the Commission about the Maverik access brought up at the last meeting, wanted to be sure the other parties involved were contacted and that the alley would not be shut off. Commissioners all agreed at the last meeting but would not take action until others were contacted. Maverik does have to get a state permit but did not want to move ahead until the County approved them using the small part of County ground for that access. It still would be County property. Prosecutor Hayes will draft up an easement agreement and would like to be sure it had been surveyed and could use that legal description.

MOTION: Commissioner Payne made a motion to approve the Maverik access to go across County property, seconded by Commissioner Rasmussen, motion carried.
