BEAR LAKE COUNTY HAS AN OPENING FOR A SEASONAL NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL TECHNICIAN

JOB TITLE: Seasonal Noxious Weed Control Technician

The county noxious weed control department is looking for a qualified and motivated individual to work as a seasonal weed control technician. The primary responsibility of this position is to identify, survey, and treat noxious weeds on public and private lands within the county. The weed control technician will also educate landowners and the public about the impacts and management of noxious weeds and assist with the implementation of the county weed management plan.

The ideal candidate for this position will have:

- A high school diploma or equivalent
- A valid driver's license and a clean driving record
- A pesticide applicator license or the ability to obtain one within six months of hire
- Knowledge of noxious weed identification, biology, and control methods
- Experience with GPS, GIS, and data collection software is helpful
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team
- Ability to communicate effectively with diverse audiences
- Ability to perform physical tasks such as lifting, bending, walking, and operating equipment in various weather conditions

The weed control technician will work 40 hours per week from April to October, with some flexibility depending on weather and workload. The salary range for this position is \$15-\$18 per hour, depending on qualifications and experience.
